REMEMBERING HAL O'NEIL KESLER

Hal O'Neil Kesler, 89, of Terre Haute, IN, and originally of Marshall, IL, died Sunday, June 15, 2008, at Terre Haute Regional Hospital. He was known as Neil in his earlier years in Marshall, and as Hal in his later years in Terre Haute. He was a high school English teacher in both Indiana and Illinois. He also was a published author of two novels, several poems and short stories, and a dozen high school plays. His memberships included The Dramatists Guild and Sons of the American Revolution. During World War II he was in the 113th Anti-aircraft Artillery Gun Battalion and

served in England, North Africa, France, Belgium and Germany. Following the war, he entered Indiana State Teachers College where he earned both his Bachelor's and Master's degrees. He also taught there for a year as a graduate assistant. In college he met Mary Elizabeth Weidner of Cissna Park, IL, and the two were married in 1951. Survivors include his widow, Elizabeth; two brothers, John A. Kesler of Terre Haute, and Herrick Hurst Kesler of Shawnee Mission, KS; six nieces; three nephews; several great-nieces, great-nephews and cousins. He was preceded in death by his parents, Hal H. Kesler and Clara Hurst Kesler; and an older brother, Harvey of Chiefland, FL, who died in 1994.

- Recruit new SAR applicants (friends, relatives & associates).
- Assist SAR applicants with the application and required documentation.
- Provide the Executive Committee with the name, address, email address and phone number for tracking purposes & newsletter mailings.
- Upon membership approval ensure the new member attends their first meeting for induction with their sponsor.
- Help the new member establish a pattern of attending monthly meetings.
- Introduce and welcome the new member at meetings.
- Call the member you have sponsored and ensure they receive the Newsletter and they have made meeting reservations for the month.
- Identify opportunities for the new member to help the chapter.

The Sponsor assists the candidate in becoming a member but even more critical is the transition into an active and engaged chapter member.

The **Liberty Medal** commemorates the restoration of the Statue of Liberty, reminds us of our Liberty and is presented for recruiting new members to the SAR. The medal is struck in bronze and depicts the bust of the Statue of Liberty on the obverse. The reverse has a space for the name and date of the recipient to be engraved. The medal is suspended from a gold ribbon and may be worn at any SAR event.

The medal, along with a certificate is presented by the National Society at the Annual Congress. The medal is awarded to any SAR member who is the first-line

Sponsor that recruited ten new members. A new member is defined as an individual who was not previously a SAR member, but whose membership application has been approved by the National Society.

We plan to hold a Sponsor Workshop in a few months. The Workshop will be a great opportunity to learn some of the techniques of the best Chapter genealogists and recruiters. You may want to invite a potential member to attend the workshop with you. **TIP:** when discussing our Society with potential members ask if they had any family in the Civil War and if they did then it is likely that there was an ancestor in the Revolutionary War.

I hope you will consider being a Sponsor and earning a Liberty Medal. Let us know if you would like to be on our list to work with candidates that are referred to the Executive Committee. Sponsorship is a critical element for a strong Delaware Crossing Chapter.
