President's Message

I truly hope that everyone is well and enjoying the exceptionally warm summer! Please let me begin thanking members of our Color Guard, at the Kansas Society and Chapters, along with other members who have been so active this summer participating throughout our communities representing the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) with a focus on Educating, Supporting, and Connecting. You will read of these many activities in this edition of the Liberty Bell, but there are so many other activities I hope our members will post about on social media, which is part of President General (PG) John Dodd's Communications initiative. In this message, I will provide you with some updates on the activities and outcomes of Congress held this year in Orlando, Florida, and discuss opportunities that are available to include assisting the Kansas 250th Commission with staffing a booth at the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson in September.

The National Society of the SAR held the 133rd Annual Congress at the Rosen Plaza Hotel in Orlando Florida from July 14th through Friday, Thursday, July 20, 2023. The Kansas Society was well represented to include Tim Peterman, Jeffrey Winters, Bruce Smith, Vern and Linda Welkner. Bobbie and Deb Hulse, myself and my wife Jennifer Wampler. We also had several secondary members including Brooks Lyles and Diane Ungvarsky, Harry and Carolyn Wilklow, and PG Joseph W. Dooley (2013-2014). It is worth mentioning that Past PG Dooley planning is on attending the KSSSAR 2024 Annual Conference. We truly hope that we can increase the number of KSSSAR members who attend Congress, so please let us know if you have any desire to attend!

Very early in the Congress, Past PG Warren Alter (2018-2019) set the tone by stating that "It is time to focus on the positives and not the negatives." This of act leadership was grasped, and the Congress was professional, cordial, and extremely efficient. The election was completed via acclamation without a formal The topic of having vote. difficulty across the country to gain access to our public schools was discussed, and suggestions were proffered that we can still achieve our mission to educate those same students in different venues such as other organizations such as 4H, Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of the USA, and working with our Junior members and the Children of the American Revolution.

You have probably heard that a \$15.00 increase in dues was approved at the 133rd Congress. The justification for the increase included raising dues to maintain current National Level programs and projects. It was mentioned that National has been operating at a deficit for the past three years, but only able to continue because of the PPP loans during the COVID period that have been forgiven. It was also "pointed out" that many of the approved projects have been stalled due to a lack of funding, to include 250th celebration activities. Believe it was the Register General who said that the lack of funding has also delayed the development of the online application app, which has been requested by almost all societies. There was a valiant effort to keep dues at the current levels, spread the increase over 3 to 5 years, or to reduce the increase, but a majority of the delegates approved of the increase. The increase took effect on August 1. Thanks to the leadership of Jordan Chambers. John Schwartz, and Tim Peterman the Kansas Society has 33 new life members who were able to avoid the increase in cost. Life Membership is still something encourage we consider. members to avoiding having to worry about annual National and State dues.

Some highlights for the Kansas Society at Congress included Compatriot Bobbie Hulse being installed as the South Central District Vice President General, Chaplain General Vern Welkner concluding his year in the position, Historian General Brooks Lyles continuing for one year as Historian General and his successful change of command as the National Color Guard Commander, and the Kansas Society Receiving numerous awards, streamers and recognition that will be distributed at the August 2023

Board of Governors meeting in Emporia.

During the most recent session of the Kansas Legislature, Kansas Statute 74-50 "The established Kansas commission for the United States Semiquincentennial" as a part the department of commerce to plan, encourage, develop and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States and to recognize the impact of this event on the people of Kansas and the nation's past, present and future. The KSSSAR President is a named member. and I am serving on what is now called the Kansas 250th Commission with Compatriot Vern Welkner as an alternate. You will soon be hearing of opportunities to support Semiguincentennial activities in Kansas, which will help members earn points towards the SAR Bronze, Silver, and Gold 250th Anniversary Medals. The first event will be the Kansas State Fair in Hutchenson from September 9 through September 17. Timeslots are available each day from 8:45 to 1:00, 1:00 to 5:00, and 5:00 to 9:00. We hope to have members of our Color Guard. and other members, staff the booth and the story of Semiquincentennial, but also spread the word about membership in the Kansas Society. I personally plan on volunteering on two separate

days. Please contact Color Guard Commander Bill Marshall if you are interested in volunteering.

In closing, let me once again thank each member of the Kansas Society for being a member and working to foster patriotism and promoting fellowship. I believe we can continue to achieve our goals and objectives by working together and inspiring each other while involving our family members. I look forward to seeing many of you at different events soon!


