President's Message

Fall's cooler temperatures have arrived and with it the special events of the season. This past quarter has been busy for the Society. I want to update you on some of the activities that have occurred since the most recent Liberty Bell and highlight a few of the upcoming events and focus areas.

First of all, thank you to all members of the Kansas Society Sons of the American Revolution (KSSSAR) for your efforts to Educate, Support, and Connect in your chapters and communities! A special thank you to:

- our Publicity Director/Recording Secretary Steve Hamlin for his continued excellence in publishing the Liberty Bell;
- the South-Central District Officers (Vice President General Bobbie Hulse (PM), Treasurer John Schwartz (WA), Secretary Steve Hamlin (WA)) for a successful Annual Meeting in Wichita;
- the members of the Color Guard led by Color Guard Commander Bill Marshall for representing the KSSSAR at events throughout Kansas, and periodically outside the state;
- and members who are continuously active in their communities.

Annual Renewal of Membership. The arrival of fall also means the time for the renewal of your KSSSAR. Our Registrar/Membership Secretary Tim Peterman reports that as of October 17, 2023, approximately seventy five percent of our members have renewed or are Life Members. As always, we encourage you to consider life membership which is available for payment online. The advantage is not having to pay national or state dues each year.

Compatriot Peterman reports that we have more than 800 inactive members who are eligible to return to active membership. Compatriot Peterman periodically provides the complete lists of Inactive Members with their most recent contact information to Chapter Presidents.

I encourage all members to reach out to former members and invite them back to the organization.

A personal connection and involvement can help retain a member as Past President Vern Welkner has mentioned. Retaining and reinstating compatriots is the most effective way to grow our membership, since becoming a new member can be a difficult, timely, and costly process.

The 3 R's. The National Membership Committee Chair Derek Brown (California) has asked societies to focus on **Recruiting**, **Retention**, **and Reinstatements**. The KSSSAR continues to grow thanks to the tremendous work of our Genealogists, who are happy to assist referrals of possible members.

Each member can be a recruiter by focusing on men they encounter who may be potential members, includes friends, professional colleagues, members of other organizations you belong to, and especially family members. Once someone becomes a member, it is critical to establish a personal connection with him so that he feels engaged and wants to stay.

My story is probably typical. When I joined the SAR, I honestly did not plan to get involved, but I was greeted at the door of my first meeting by Compatriot Charles Goslin. Before I had left the meeting, then-Chapter President Craig Dillavou had recruited me to become the Programs Chair. It is because of the mentorship and encouragement of others that I expanded my involvement. I ask that you also start sharing your story and the reasons you have continued your KSSSAR membership, which may encourage others to continue in the KSSSAR.

The National Society Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR) Communications Committee.

The NSSAR Communications Committee is in the process of publishing guides to help societies, chapters, and members to present a unified and coherent message. These guides will include the Mission Statement and Elevator Pitch (both listed below), and the soon-to-be-distributed Marketing Plan. Compatriot Tom Jackson (Texas) presented the concepts at the 2023 South-Central District Annual Meeting and stated that state societies will receive additional information concerning the committee's brand and engagement guide that will further expand upon the national marketing plan.

In efforts to reach out to the public, President General Dodd (California) encourages all members to actively engage with others through personal interactions and various social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, and YouTube.

2023 Fall Leadership. The 2023 Fall Leadership event, held in Louisville, Kentucky at the Brown Hotel from September 21 - 23, was a productive and engaging meeting. Attendees included South-Central District Vice President General Bobbie (PM) and Debbie Hulse, Immediate Past President Vern and Linda Welkner (HL), Vice President Tim Peterman (DX), Eastern Assistant Vice President Jeffrey Winters (MC), Bruce (DX) and Deborah Smith, Ashley Null (BN), and myself, accompanied by my wife Jennifer.

By having more members attend, we could ensure a stronger Kansas presence in the various NSSAR committees and meetings. 

Youth Protection

Hello compatriots.

For those of you I have not yet met, my name is Bruce Smith. I am the KSSSAR Youth Coordinator for 2023.

Part of our requirements from the National Society Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR) is to ensure that chapter officers, compatriots involved in youth contests, and any chapter member in contact with our youth as part of chapter activities (ex., color guard) complete the NSSAR-approved Youth Protection training program. This training is available on the NSSAR website (sar.org).

Sometimes we may forget the circumstances in which we contact youth, such as parades, school presentations, fairs, libraries, grave markings, citizenship ceremonies, honor flights, wreath laying, cemetery or memorial remembrances, and many other events. So, it is worthwhile to consider less obvious situations in addition to the more formal events which immediately come to mind.

Many of us have taken the Youth Protection course in the past, but the certificate issued has an expiration date and, therefore, needs to be renewed periodically. I do not know or have access to the status of each individual KSSSAR member's training records. Therefore, it is incumbent on each current KSSSAR member to be responsible for ascertaining their status

and renewing this training as applicable to their expiration date and the role they serve within their chapter or KSSSAR.

And, of course, newly initiated members must be made aware of this requirement to get their initial certification.

An important part of this renewal requirement is to keep this serious matter at the top of our minds and to allow for introducing new material into the training, which updates the standards in this area. We are all aware of litigation related to Youth Protection violations in various organizations and need to ensure KSSSAR and our chapters do not have similar issues due to a lack of awareness or proper training.

Please log into your accounts on the NSSAR website (sar.org) and complete this course which can be accessed on the eLearning portal. When successfully completed, the member will be able to print a certificate. This is important as state and local chapter officers do not have access to a report of those compatriots who have completed this training; only the individual member does. Each member needs to provide a copy of this renewed certificate of training to their chapter secretary for their local records.

In addition, members of the KSSSAR Board of Governors (BOG) need to send a copy of their renewed certificate to the KSSSAR Secretary for their records.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter.

Youth Contests

It is that time of the year when we get energized to support the important goals of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR):

"... promoting patriotism and educating and inspiring future generations about the founding principles of our country."

At many meetings I attend, I hear Compatriots express concern over the loss of our patriotic values and the diminution of teaching about the Revolution in school curricula. But we can all do our part to overcome this.

We do this through many means, including through our youth contests:

Rumbaugh Oration, Knight Essay, Eagle Scout Contest, Elementary School Poster, and Middle School Brochure contests.

We should also not forget the American History Teacher contest conducted for middle and high school teachers.

These contests begin with completed submissions at the chapter level, followed by the submission of the winning entry for each contest from each chapter to the appropriate contest chairman at the Kansas Society Sons of the American Revolution level (KSSSAR). The KSSSAR website (KSSSAR.org) and national website (NSSSAR.org) have information on each contest, and the KSSSAR website has information on the applicable state-level contacts who are available to answer questions on the rules and contest requirements, as well as provide advice.

For reference, these contacts are:

- 1. Stuart Conrad, Knight Essay
- 2. Kirk Rush, Eagle Scout Contest
- 3. Recil Robinson, Poster, and Brochure, and
- 4. Bruce Smith, Rumbaugh Oration, and American History Teacher.

The Rumbaugh Oration, Knight Essay, and Eagle Scout contests have a December 31, 2023, chapter-level submission deadline.

Decisions on the state-level winners for these three contests are known by or on the date of the February BOG meeting. It is important to remind Oration participants that they need to plan to attend the February BOG meeting in person to compete against other applicants. The BOG Meeting is usually held in Emporia, KS.

The other contests have a slightly later due date, and the state winners are selected at the KSSSAR annual conference, held in March 2024.

Our youth applicants have represented Kansas well, winning the Rumbaugh Oration National Finals in 2022 and having National Finalists in the Knight Essay in 2022 and 2023.

Let's help keep this momentum going and, in the process, encourage our applicant's interest in the founding of our great country.


